STARTING SCHOOL OR BACK TO SCHOOL



Here are some helpful tips for a less stressful school year.



- Remind your child of their allergy and anaphylaxis triggers before school starts.
- Keep a printed list of your child's allergies in their school bag, locker or on noticeboards.
- Teach your child to recognise early symptoms of a reaction and to alert staff immediately.
- Reinforce the importance of not sharing food or drink.
- Review and discuss the school's playground food policy for allergy safety.
- Inform the school of your child's allergies and emergency plan.
- If there are several children with anaphylaxis, suggest a talk or demo at assembly.
- Share your experiences and tips in the school newsletter.
- Confirm where the EpiPen® Auto-Injectors will be stored at school and ensure your child knows.
- Provide the school with a printed copy of your child's ASCIA Action Plan.
- ALWAYS keep 2 in-date EpiPens at school and pack 2 for school trips.
